

**An Expanded Study on the Gurulé Family**  
**Correcting Erroneous Information on the Internet**

I've been working on the Gurulé families since 1998 -- that's when I got bit by the genealogy bug. My grandmother, Rafaela Gurulé (born in 1891 in Albuquerque), was easy to trace and I really lucked out as the Gurulé family was well documented in the church records. I fell in love with genealogy; however, I think I went a little crazy. I started extracting every single Gurulé record that I could find. I just knew sooner or later that they would all just match together, like one huge puzzle.

Since I was so new, my ears were open to all the advice I could get. I always remember one researcher telling me, "never trust what you find on-line. You don't know if the person who posted the information knew what they were doing." So one of my earliest lessons in genealogy was to obtain and note source material.

That brings me to Juan Andres Gurulé. You see, Juan Andres Gurulé is one of millions of entries in the Mormon Church's database (<http://www.FamilySearch.org>). This database is the biggest collection of on-line records, but many people don't realize that it contains errors.

I love helping people, and every now and then somebody contacts me who traces back to Juan Andres Gurulé. Oh no, here we go again. I already know what's going to happen because I know where the error is found – it's in the Mormons' database.

The record, submitted by Richard Marquez of Rio Rancho, NM, shows that "Andres or Juan Gurulé" was born in 1773 in Belen, NM, went on to have a long life married to Pasquala Griego. This record also shows that Andres Gurulé was the son of Serafin Gurulé and Maria Gertrudis Aragon. Serafin was the grandson of Jacques Grolet (aka Santiago Gurulé) -- see genealogy report.

This record doesn't match my records which show that Juan Andres Gurulé died as a baby and did not leave a family.

This past year, I decided to contact the Mr. Marquez to try to correct the records. Trust me; it's not easy to tell someone that their genealogy research is wrong. The submitter was really nice, but basically told me, "Prove me wrong." I told him that if I did, would he retract the error from the Mormons' database? He said yes. Below is the baptism record for Juan Andres Gurulé, and then his death record 8 days later.

My efforts to correct this error have proved fruitless. Months later, I can only say that the Mormons refuse to change their database. Their response to me has been "submit another tree with the correct information." This doesn't help with the incorrect record that's in their database. Unfortunately, it also means that I'm going to get contacted in the future, again, by the next person who finds this Juan Andres Gurulé. I can't tell you who he was as I never found his parents, but I know who he wasn't.

If I find an error in other databases such as the Great New Mexico Database, it is easy to contact the webmaster, point out the error, present the new evidence, and the error is corrected.

I've got a beautiful website that was built in 2000 by Leon Moya (a Gurulé descendent) who lives in New South Wales, Australia. The website, <http://www.GuruleFamily.org>, documents the main Gurulé descendants originating in La Rochelle, France, and also 13 other lines, including some of the Indian lines with the Gurulé surname. Over the years, my collection of Gurulé records continues to grow. I give full credit for the early Gurulé research to Virginia Olmsted, a well-known Albuquerque genealogist who passed in 1991. She documented her findings in her article, "Grolet-Gurulé: Los Franceses of Nueva Mexico," published in the National Genealogical Society Quarterly, March 1987, Volume 75, Number 1.

I've taken her material, fixed a few things, and expanded it. I don't have everything posted on my website, but the information that is posted contains source documentation. I'm always more than willing to help anybody. Am I perfect? Oh no, not by any means. But at least I can tell you how I came up with a family's connection. As genealogical research has progressed in many ways, with the extraction and publication of new material, one of the newest forms of searching is through DNA testing. The New Mexico DNA Project has been obtaining DNA samples from people throughout the world and as more people test, we will probably find more information on the Gurulé family.

***Descendants of Santiago Gurulé & Elena Gallegos***  
*Generation No. 1*

**1. Santiago<sup>2</sup> Gurulé** (Yvon<sup>1</sup> Grolet) was born about 1663 in La Rochelle, Kingdom of France, and died about 1711 in Bernalillo, New Mexico. He married **Elena Gallegos** on 9 Dec 1699 in Bernalillo, New Mexico, daughter of Antonio Gallegos and Catalina Baca. She was born about 1680 in Bernalillo, New Mexico, and died 21 Sep 1731 in Bernalillo, New Mexico.

Notes for Santiago Gurulé:

*[Olmsted's research]* Baptized Jacques Grolet at the Church of St. Jean, La Rochelle, Kingdom of France. He came to the New World as a member of the La Salle Expedition of 1685-1687, with two other members of the La Salle expedition (Pedro Meusnier and Juan L'Archiveque). The three men were "lost" for five years among the Indians, and then sent to Spain by order of the Viceroy, the Conde de Galve. After returning to New Spain, the three men came up to New Mexico with the Captain Cristoval de Velasco/Fray Francisco Farfan expedition to re-conquer the Kingdom of New Mexico from the rebellious Indians, arriving in Santa Fe on 23 Jun 1694.

The three Frenchmen had been imprisoned in Cadiz, Spain, until their release in 1692. The conditions of their release required that they become Spanish citizens and return to Nueva España. At Mexico City, these Frenchmen either requested, or were ordered, by the Viceroy to accompany the colonizing expedition bound for New Mexico. The French name, Grole or Grolet, soon evolved into Gurulé, and this was further Hispanicized by 19th century Padres into Guruled; the spelling went back midway to the present Gurulé.

Notes for Elena Gallegos:

*[Olmsted's research]* Elena drafted her will, 1 May 1731, leaving the bulk of her property to her only son and heir, Antonio Gurulé. Opening her will with the customary professions of faith, she requested that she be buried in the parish church of the villa of Albuquerque, garbed in the robes of the order of St. Francis, and she asked that her funeral be "most humble because of my being a poor widow." The will was offered for probate on 6 Feb 1732, but the burial registers of the Albuquerque church (film #16645) carry a cryptic entry that suggests she died some five months earlier: "21 Sep 1731 -- buried the widow Elena"

Marriage Notes for Santiago Gurulé and Elena Gallegos:

1699, Nov. 9 (no. 5), San Felipe, Bernalillo. SANTIAGO GROLE, native of La Rothela in the French Realms, baptized in the church of St. Jean, son of Yvon Grole and Maria Odon (Odoe ?), both deceased, and doña Elena Gallegos (19), native of Bernalillo, daughter of Antonio Gallegos and doña Catarina Baca. Groom left France in company of the General Marshall de la Salle in search of continental region bordering on New France; was captive of infidel Indians for 5 years; then went to Spain by order of Viceroy Conde de Galve; back in Mexico City, he then came to New Mexico as a settler. Witnesses: Pedro de Chaves, notary; Pedro Meusnier (26), native of

Paris in France who knew groom for 15 years; Juan de Archibec (27), native of Ballona in France who also knew groom for 15 years; Baltasar Romero, Pedro Lopez, Felipe Gutierrez (40), Mestizo. [Prenuptial Investigations - NM Roots Ltd., page 780]

**2. Antonio<sup>3</sup> Gurulé** (Santiago<sup>2</sup>, Yvon<sup>1</sup> Grolet) was baptized 2 Apr 1703 in Bernalillo, New Mexico, and died 18 Apr 1761. He married **Antonia Quintana** 27 Jul 1718 in Bernalillo, New Mexico, daughter of Jose Quintana and Antonia Lujan Dominguez. She was born about 1705.

Enumerated in the 1750 census – NM, Villa de Albuquerque (page 75)

Antonio Gurulé (Spanish, 1705, age 45), Antonia Quintana (Spanish, 1705, age 45), Juan Antonio (1733, age 17), Fabiana (1734, age 16), Seraphin (1739, age 11), Elena (1741, age 9), Francisca (1743, age 7), Manuela (1746, age 4); servant: Rosa (Indian, 1710, age 40), Juan (1732, age 18), Juan (1738, age 12), Antonio (1742, age 8), Mathias (1744, age 6), Tomas (1746, age 4); Servant: Bernardina (Indian, 1720, age 30), Maria Antonia (1734, age 16), Ygnacio (1739, age 11), Joseph (1741, age 9), Josepha (1744, age 6), Maria (1747, age 3)

*[Olmsted's research] Antonio Gurulé, probably born shortly before his baptism on 2 Apr 1703, married at age 18 to Antonia Quintana, age 16, daughter of Jose Quintana (a neighbor and one of the witnesses to Elena Gallegos' will) by Quintana's wife Antonia Lujan Dominguez; he died 18 Apr 1761. When Antonio made his will, he stated that he had been married to Antonia Quintana for 40 years and were the parents of nine children (all were named in the document).*

**3. Maria Manuela<sup>4</sup> Gurulé** (Antonio<sup>3</sup>, Santiago<sup>2</sup>, Yvon<sup>1</sup> Grolet) was born about 1722, and died before 5 Mar 1757 in Albuquerque, New Mexico<sup>1</sup>. She married **Baltazar Griego** on 20 Mar 1737 in San Felipe de Neri Church, Albuquerque, New Mexico son of Juan Griego and Juliana Saíz. He was born about 1718 and was widowed of Ysabel Jaramillo at the time of this marriage.

Enumerated in the 1750 census – NM, Villa de Albuquerque (page 75)  
Balthazar Griego (Spanish, 1728, age 32), Manuela (Spanish, 1721, age 29), Domingo (1741, age 9), Rosalia (1743, age 7), Pasqual (1745, age 5), Antonia (1747, age 3), Paulina (1750, age one month); servant: Maria Antonia (Indian, 1741, age 9)

Children of Maria Manuela Gurulé and Baltazar Griego are:

- 12 i. Domingo<sup>5</sup> Griego, born about 1741; died before Jun 1781. He married Josefa Fulgencia Gallegos 20 Jan 1763 in Albuquerque, New Mexico<sup>80</sup> daughter of Nicolas Gallegos and Ysabel Jaramillo; she was baptized 27 Feb 1735 in Albuquerque, New Mexico<sup>2</sup>.

- 16 v. Antonia Griego, baptized 22 Jan 1748 in Albuquerque, New Mexico<sup>5</sup>. She married Salvador Gallegos on 3 Mar 1764 in San Felipe de Neri Church, Albuquerque, New Mexico<sup>83</sup> son of Nicolas Gallegos and Ysabel Jaramillo; he was born about 1739 in New Mexico.

Notes for Antonia Griego: In her baptism record, Antonia was listed as a male, however no other males have been found by this name and her age is consistent with other records.

Marriage Notes for Antonia Griego and Salvador Gallegos:

1764, Jun 20 (no. 1, 7), Albuquerque. Salvador Jaramillo (25), Español, no parents given, and Antonia Griego (15), Española, daughter of Captain Baltasar Griego and Manuela Gurulé, deceased. Witnesses: Felipe Jacobo Romero, notary; Juan Candelaria (70), who says that Antonia Dominguez, great-grandmother of the bride, and Leonor Dominguez, groom's grandmother, were sisters; Francisco Perea (54), Jose Apodaca (42). Note: Salvador used his mother's surname on this record. [Prenuptial Investigations - NM Roots Ltd., page 856].

- 17 vi. Paulina Griego, baptized 28 Jun 1750 in Albuquerque, New Mexico<sup>6</sup>. She married Jose Antonio Lopez on 19 May 1777 in San Felipe de Neri Church, Albuquerque, New Mexico<sup>84</sup> son of Diego Lopez and Juana Candelaria; he was baptized 17 Feb 1752 in Albuquerque, New Mexico<sup>7</sup>.

Marriage Notes for Paulina Griego and Jose Antonio Lopez:

1777, May 10 (no. 13), Albuquerque. Jose Antonio Lopez (21), Español, son of Diego Lopez, deceased, and Juana Candelaria, and Maria Griego, Española, daughter of Baltasar Griego and Manuela Gurulé. Witnesses: Manuel de Arteaga, notary; Buenaventura Lopez (56), Diego Gonzales (48), Martin Apodaca (43). [Prenuptial Investigations - NM Roots Ltd., page 924]

Juan Bautista Griego (16), Español, son of Baltasar Griego and Isabel (no surname), and Maria Manuela Ortega (15), Española, daughter of Jose Antonio Ortega, deceased, and Maria Apodaca. Witnesses: Manuel de Arteaga, notary; Cristobal Sedillo (53), Felipe Apodaca (60), Jose Saavedra (25). [Prenuptial Investigations - NM Roots Ltd., page 763]

**4. Tomas<sup>4</sup> Gurulé** (Antonio<sup>3</sup>, Santiago<sup>2</sup>, Yvon<sup>1</sup> Grolet) was born about 1725, and died 28 Dec 1786 in Albuquerque, New Mexico. He married **Maria Pasquala Griego** on 19 Sep 1743 in San Felipe de Neri Church, Albuquerque, New Mexico<sup>86</sup> daughter of Juan Griego and Juliana Saíz. She was born about 1728, and died before 25 May 1785 in Albuquerque, New Mexico<sup>9</sup>.

Enumerated in the 1750 census – NM, Villa de Albuquerque (page 75)

Tomas Gurulé (Spanish, 1725, age 25), Pasquala Griego (Spanish, 1728, age 22), Usebio (1744, age 6), Juan Pablo (1747, age 3)

Children of Tomas Gurulé and Maria Pascuala Griego are:

- 19 i. Eusebio<sup>5</sup> Gurulé, baptized 10 Mar 1745 in Albuquerque, New Mexico<sup>10</sup>; died after Mar 1785. He married Maria Ylaria Montaña on 5 Jul 1764 in San Felipe

- de Neri Church, Albuquerque, New Mexico<sup>86</sup> daughter of Antonio Montañño and Maria Francisca Casias; she was baptized 24 Feb 1745 in Albuquerque, New Mexico<sup>11</sup>; she died before 17 Mar 1785 in Albuquerque, New Mexico<sup>12</sup>.

She died before Sep 1781 when Bernabe married (2) Maria Monica Montoya on 8 Sep 1781 in Church of San Antonio de Sandia, Bernalillo, New Mexico<sup>88</sup>; she was born about 1766.

Marriage Notes for Bernabe Gurulé and Juana Gutierrez:

1777, Feb. 6 (no. 6), Albuquerque. Bernabe Antonio Gurulé, Español, son of Tomas Gurulé and Maria Pascuala Griego, and Juana Tomasa Gutierrez (15), Española, daughter of Francisco Xavier Gutierrez and Rosa Miranda, deceased. Witnesses: Manuel de Arteaga, notary; Cristobal Gonzales (25), Juan Rafael Pacheco (60), Vicente Duran (40). [Prenuptial Investigations - NM Roots Ltd., page 781]

*[Olmsted's research] Bernabe was a farmer, living in Albuquerque, Santa Fe, and Bernalillo before finally settling in Las Huertas, as confirmed by census and church records.*

Bernabe Gurulé (Spanish, 40, native of Tome, farmer), Monica Sandoval (Mestiza, 20); 2 sons (9, 7)

- 23 v. Antonia Gurulé, died 2 Oct 1755 in Albuquerque, New Mexico<sup>16</sup>.
- 24 vi. Pedro Bautista de Jesus Gurulé, baptized 5 Feb 1766 in Albuquerque, New Mexico<sup>17</sup>. He married Maria Dolores Duran on 2 Nov 1786 in San Felipe de Neri Church, Albuquerque, New Mexico<sup>86</sup>; she was born about 1764 in Las Huertas, New Mexico.

*[Angela's note]* It should be noted that no conclusive proof exists for the marriage of Pedro Bautista to Dolores Duran. The time, place and notation from Olmsted's research lead to this conclusion.

Pedro Gurulé (coyote, 1765, age 25, spinner), Maria Dolores Duran (Mestiza, 1764, age 26), two sons (ages 7 and 2)

**5. Luisa de Jesus<sup>4</sup> Gurulé** (Antonio<sup>3</sup>, Santiago<sup>2</sup>, Yvon<sup>1</sup> Grolet) was baptized 27 Jun 1731 in Albuquerque, New Mexico<sup>18</sup>, and died 10 Apr 1776 in Albuquerque, New Mexico<sup>19</sup>. She married **Tadeo Garcia de Noriega** on 24 Apr 1746 in San Felipe de Neri Church, Albuquerque, New Mexico<sup>86</sup> son of Vicente Garcia de Noriega and Catarina Gonzales.

*[Olmsted's research] By 1750, Luisa and Tadeo were living next door to Luisa's parents, who apparently thought much of this son-in-law, since Antonio Gurulé named his daughter's husband as his co-executor and called him "my son." No record has been found of the death of either Luisa or Tadeo, although it is known that he preceded her in death; on 15 May 1775, his widow and a son were padrinos at a family baptism.*

Children of Luisa Gurulé and Tadeo Garcia de Noriega are:

- 25 i. Ysidro<sup>5</sup> Garcia, baptized 21 May 1747 in Albuquerque, New Mexico<sup>20</sup>; died before Feb 1777. He married Juana Barbara Aragon on 14 Dec 1769 in San Felipe Mission, New Mexico<sup>89</sup> daughter of Andres Aragon and Elena Duran y Chaves

*[Olmsted's research] Married briefly to Ysidro Garcia, who died before 15 Feb 1777, because she is shown, along with Miguel Antonio Gamboa, as subjects of a premarital investigation as preparation for their proposed wedding. Gamboa was the widower of her husband's sister, Maria Rosa Garcia.*

- 26 ii. Gerardo Cristobal Garcia, baptized 14 Dec 1749 in Albuquerque, New Mexico<sup>21</sup>; died before 1790. He married Maria Ana Santillanes; she died before 1790.
- 27 iii. Pablo Garcia, baptized 25 Jan 1752 in Albuquerque, New Mexico<sup>22</sup>.
- 28 iv. Antonio Vicente Garcia, baptized 10 Nov 1754 in Albuquerque, New Mexico<sup>23</sup>; died before Oct 1804. He married Maria Francisca Chavez; she died before Oct 1804.
- 29 v. Maria Rosalia Garcia, baptized 17 Apr 1757 in Albuquerque, New Mexico<sup>24</sup>; died 5 Apr 1776 in Albuquerque, New Mexico. She married Miguel Antonio Gamboa on 24 Oct 1772 in Albuquerque, New Mexico<sup>90</sup> son of Agustin Gamboa and Manuela Lucero; he was born about 1742.

1772, Oct. 24 (no. 15), Albuquerque. Miguel Antonio Gamboa (30), Español, son of Agustin Gamboa, deceased, and Manuela Lucero, and Maria Rosalia Garcia de Noriega (12), Española, d. of Tadeo Garcia de Noriega and Luisa Gurulé. Witnesses: Felipe Jacobo Romero, notary; Andres Antonio Romero (43), Francisco Cordova (45) of Atrisco. [Prenuptial Investigations - NM Roots Ltd., page 585]

**6. Juan Antonio<sup>4</sup> Gurulé** (Antonio<sup>3</sup>, Santiago<sup>2</sup>, Yvon<sup>1</sup> Grolet) was baptized 1 Jun 1733 in Albuquerque, New Mexico<sup>25</sup>, and died in Las Huertas, New Mexico. He married **Maria**



**Petrona Montoya** on 2 Jun 1754 in Saint Francis of Assisi Church, Santa Fe, New Mexico. She died in Las Huertas, New Mexico.

Enumerated in the 1790 – NM, Bernalillo County, Albuquerque, Plaza #7

He was born 1 Jun 1733 in Bernalillo, New Mexico, and died 9 Dec 1782 in Guadalupe El Paso.

*[Olmsted's research] Elena Gurulé was the second wife of Jose Duran y Chavez of Bernalillo, to whom she was married about 1765. When Chavez was accidentally killed in 1783, there ensued a lengthy succession (probate) process involving the children of his first marriage. Elena and Jose were the parents of nine children.*

In later research by Pat Sanchez Rau (Colorado), she uncovers the mystery of the first wife of Jose Duran y Chavez in the 1783 estate settlement papers where descendants of both wives were present. The first wife was Antonia Gurulé, most likely the daughter of Bernardina who was an Indian servant and appears in the New Mexico 1750 census in the household of Antonio Gurulé and Antonia Quintana. Pat Rau's article "A Further Study of Jose Duran y Chaves and His Two Wives with Some New Conclusions", was published by Herencia, Volume 11 Issue 4 October 2003 and is also available on the Gurulé web site.

Their two youngest children were baptized at San Juan after they moved to the Rio Arriba country.
